A major collaboration of more than 50 health and API organizations, San Francisco Hep B Free is the beginning of an unprecedented two-year long campaign to screen, vaccinate, and treat all API residents for hepatitis B (HBV) — a serious liver disease responsible for 80% of all liver cancers among API.

San Francisco has the highest liver cancer rate in the country. APIs are up to 100 times more likely to suffer from chronic HBV infection than the general population. Without proper care, 1 in 4 APIs living with chronic hepatitis B will die from liver cancer or liver failure, yet this is a vaccine-preventable disease.
